Hello everyone, As you know from the last newsletter article written by CC Andy Adams, I took the mantle from him on the 14th February this year as the temporary Chief Constable. Since then, I have successfully been appointed substantively into the post and I am absolutely delighted to be leading the MDP. I have now been with the MDP for 17 months and the time has flown. One of my

main missions was to ensure that I really understood how the force was so different to the other police forces I have worked in and so I have been out visiting and speaking to people as much as I can.
