Force News

Recruitment remains difficult, new proposals for recruiting into 'difficult' areas such as AWE are being looked at, including potential monetary incentives.

The reviews currently underway in the Force remain on-going and linking in with the wider MOD including the dog review that has been postponed allowing the organisation sufficient time to complete the formal consultation phase with DPF and Trade Unions.

The Deputy Chief Constable recently hosted a workshop, to provide guidance on the promotion process for Superintendents. This process is open to both internal and external candidates.

Pensions Update

All public sector pensions, including the Civil Service pension, are index-linked to inflation, with increases since 2011 being based on the preceding September Consumer Price Index (CPI). The anticipated increase from the 8th April 2024 will therefore be 6.7%, based on the ONS announcement on 18th October 2023 of the September figure for the CPI. The full increase only applies to pensions that have been in payment for a full year on the 8th April 2024, so those who have more recently retired will see their increases applied pro rata.

Triple Lock

Chancellor, Jeremy Hunt, said in his Autumn Statement on 22nd November 2023 that the government's commitment to the State pensions triple lock is to be honoured in full. This means that from April 2024 the government will increase the full 'new' state pension by 8.5% to £221.20 a week, which is worth up to £900 more a year for pensioners.

Police Covenant

The Police Covenant' is a government commitment to ensure the health and wellbeing of members and former members of the police service, their physical protection and the support required by members of their families. The Covenant became law in 2022 and extends to non-home office forces – MDP, BTP and CNC. At the moment it is not clear how it will apply to MDP or indeed too retired officers. DPF confirm that the three non-home office forces have signed an agreement to work together on the various issues but at this stage there is little information on how MDP propose ** is with this.

Force Liaison Officer Says Farewell



Superintendent Sandy Stewart attended his last AGM as Force Liaison Officer ahead of retirement from the force in February 2024. At the gala dinner Chairman, Geoff Heal, on behalf of the association was pleased to present Sandy with a gift in recognition of his help and support since taking on the role in 2016. In due course we look forward to welcoming Sandy as a new member.

In a career spanning nearly 39 years Sandy joined MDP in 1985 at CSB Faslane. He gained promotion to Sergeant in 1992 and transferred to Rosyth, and later spent time at ATR Glencorse prior to promotion to Inspector on 1st September 1998 resulting in a move back to Clyde. In 2003 came promotion to Chief Inspector and after two years moved to Scotland Divisional HQ in the role of Ch Insp Ops Support.

In 2014 Sandy transferred to HQ Wethersfield as T/Superintendent Ops then a year later promoted to the rank of Superintendent. In 2016 he became Head of OCC during which time was appointed to the role of Force Liaison Officer. Some three years later came a return to Clyde as Group Supt. In a final move to his career Sandy transferred to Menwith Hill as Group Supt. We wish Sandy a long and happy retirement.
